Hello Board,

I was reviewing my records when I noticed that I might have been remiss in responding to something that you wrote on August 13, 2025.

On August 23, 2025, I wrote to you the following:

"In the email to which I am replying right now, you wrote about our Internal Waiting List. I'll address that in a separate email."

On August 13, 2025, you wrote to me the following:

"The Board's position is that the format of the Internal Waiting List is determined collaboratively, but operational implementation is the responsibility of staff. If you wish to suggest a different system or presentation of the list, we welcome you to bring that suggestion forward in a public forum such as a members' meeting or the Weekly, ideally framed without accusations about others' intentions. This will help ensure the discussion is constructive and more likely to gain community support."

I apologize if I haven't yet replied to your important thoughts, above. Please consider my response below.

I would like our Internal Waiting List to be presented as it has been historically. I have no desire for it to be changed. I'm sorry if I have caused this misunderstanding.

It is my hope that the Board will instruct our Homestarts employees to reverse their decision to restrict our access to this information.

There is no need for me to *"...bring [a] suggestion forward in a public forum such as a members' meeting or the Weekly, ideally framed without accusations about others' intentions."*

I only want the Board to instruct our employees to reverse their decision to make the changes that have resulted in the Membership not having access to this information.

I feel threatened by your choice to use the words *"...ideally*
